Now climb up one more set of stairs. In this room you will see a large brass telescope.

Aztecs believed that many of their Gods and Goddesses had been transformed into stars. Ancient Egyptians believed that the Milky Way was a heavenly river that the sun and moon floated on.

In Dumfries a local group turned a windmill into an observatory so that people could look more closely at the moon and stars to find scientific evidence about them.
